Melvin Heath was born November 18, 1911 in Round Lake, Minnesota of Swedish and French Canadian parents. He was raised in Round Lake and in Lansford, North Dakota, and graduated from Lansford High School in 1931.

Two years later, on October 7, 1933, he married the former Helen C. Berg in Glenburn, North Dakota. Their marriage was blessed with three sons, Roland of Lincoln City, Dennis of Salem, and Curt of Troutdale.
